AgriExposure (Kaye Weaber)- Appetizer

Various Appetizers- Wine and cheese pairing introduction, followed by various choices of appetizers such as Beef Satay Skewers, Beef Brisket topped Potato Skins, Southern Fried Steak Bites, and HC Sims Italian Sausage with homemade sauces.

Beaumont Inn- Salad

BBQ Tri-Tip Salad- Barbeque spice rubbed Tri-Tip Beef roast served over oak leaf and mustard greens, tossed with apple cider, brown sugar, and Dijon dressing served with tobacco onions and fresh berries.

The Fudge Company-Entrée

Classic Homemade Meat Lasagna- Layers of lasagna noodles, tomato sauce, beef and Italian sausage, ricotta, Romano and mozzarella cheese, infused with freshly grated cheeses and herbs, farm eggs and The Fudge Company's own red sauce.

The Alamo- Dessert

Traditional Mexican Flan- A Mexican custard baked with caramelized sugar, then chilled and served with a light Bailey's Irish Cream or Rum.

The Fort Harrod Beef Festival Cattle Crawl is limited to 55 participants. Participants will take a charter bus from the Mercer County Extension Office to the four featured businesses. The price is \$50/person and includes a 4-course meal, with beverage (water, tea, and coffee), transportation during the tour and a Cattle Crawl commemorative gift. About The Beef Checkoff

The Beef Checkoff Program was established as part of the 1985 Farm Bill. The Checkoff assesses \$1 per head on the sale of live domestic and imported cattle, in addition to a comparable assessment on imported beef and beef products. States retain up to 50 cents on the dollar and forward the other 50 cents per head to the Cattlemen's Beef Promotion and Research Board, which administers the national Checkoff program, subject to USDA approval.
